Why School Programme?


- Lack of access to good quality education Every child deserves & needs holistic development especially in the formative years

- Building readiness to face the external environment from Class 9 onwards

Overall Current Scenario

We are facing unprecedented times, and the world at large is looking for ways and means to combat the alarming situations which we are confronted with. The measures being taken to safeguard against Covid-19 also brings along with it fear which is being increasingly internalised and is leading to serious consequences on mental health the impact of which will be seen in times to come. However, what we do witness around us is an increased economic pressure across all demographics and adjusting to the same is by no means a small task.

Covid-19 related Challenges -

- Complete Closure of School Premises
- Limited Awareness about COVID amongst our stakeholders
- Migration to Villages due to economic crisis approximately 15% of our families have gone to their villages and many of them plan to return as soon as situations stabilises.
- Food Crisis Parents being daily wage earners face challenges with respect to basic food requirements due to loss of jobs. Majority of our children are from migrant families they do not have ration cards of Noida address and cannot avail of the government ration distribution.
- Online engagement with children is not easy as many do not have smart phones/money to buy internet data packs or have one device at home to be shared with other siblings and parents who need their phones to go to work.
- Covid-19 Positive Cases Few families have been impacted and the emotional and financial stress over and above loss of jobs is very severe.

A. Engagement with children

B. Alternative Processes

- Training of teachers for online teaching
- Interaction with children online for career counselling
- Interacting with children in villages so that they remain engaged

C. Food distribution & Parent Meetings

- No family goes hungry, Ration distribution to cover full month's ration
- Every single family and family member is fully aware of the situation, precautions, processes and methods for testing, treatment, sanitization etc.
- Every single family has been spoken to to understand health and financial situation

Online Engagement

- More than 70% children are connected online
- Each child goes through about
 - o 3-4 hours of academics every week (core academic subjects)
 - o 1 hour of Arts & Performing Arts Activity every week
 - 1 hour of Life Skills Activity every week
- Standard Methods adopted
 - Online classes through Zoom / Google Meet / Teams
 - Online classes through Whats app groups each class has been divided into two groups
 around 10-12 children per group and they are connected with each subject teacher separately
 - Voice, Video and text messages used for online studies
 - Basis the chapter requirement, teachers also send worksheets on whats app and children revert after completion of worksheets
 - Children are given lot of activities through voice and video messages. They complete these activities and send the photographs and video messages to each teacher.
